# The Quantock Greenway



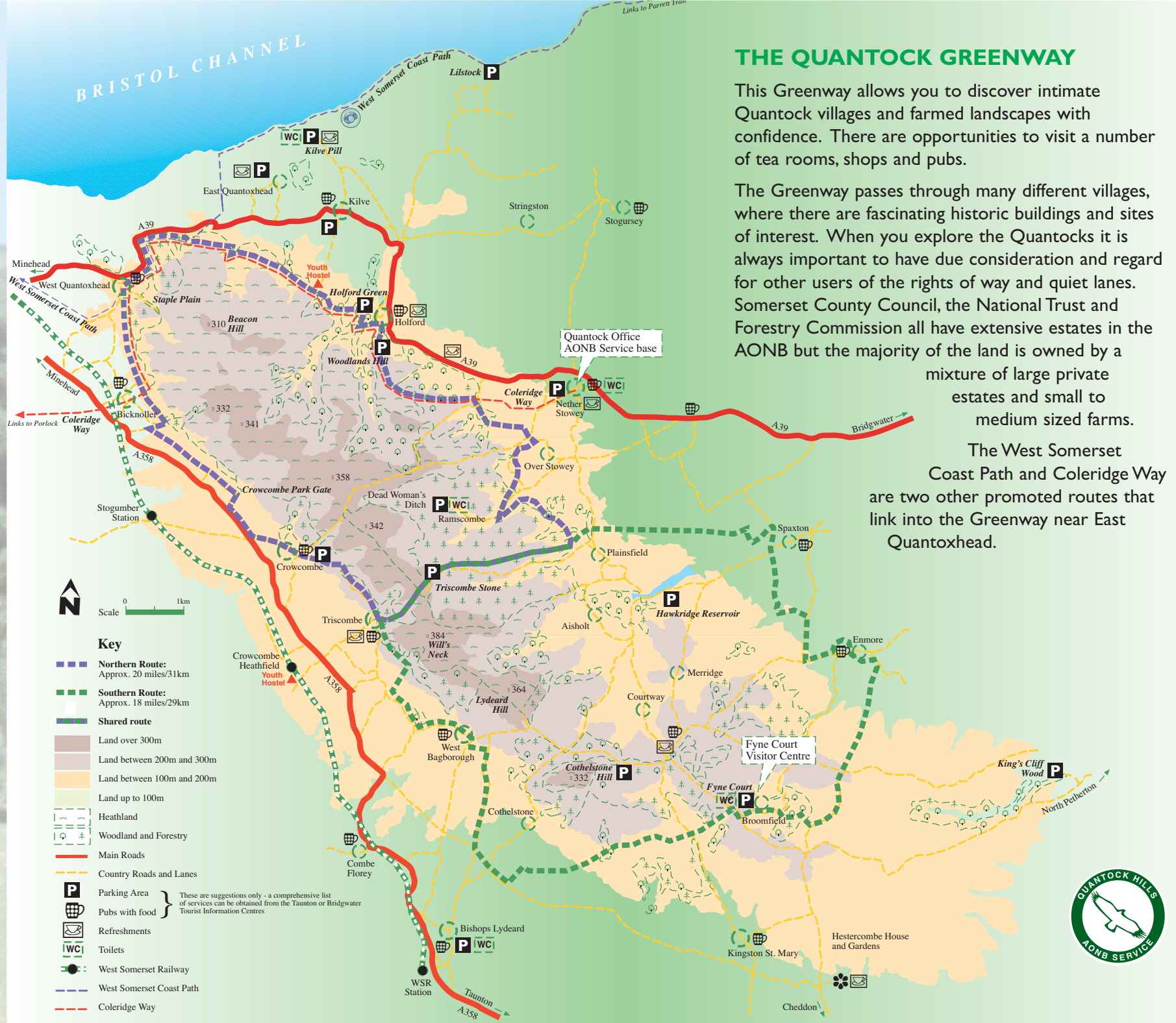
## COUNTRYSIDE ALONG THE GREENWAY

The Quantock Greenway travels through many different types of landscape, including deciduous and coniferous woodland, private parkland, grazed pasture and cropped fields. Agriculture has shaped the Quantock Hills we know over the last 2000 years. The mixture of Saxon farmland patterns and boundaries alongside 17th and 18th century parkland creates wonderful views and is of real historic interest.

## THE QUANTOCK GREENWAY

This Greenway allows you to discover intimate Quantock villages and farmed landscapes with confidence. There are opportunities to visit a number of tea rooms, shops and pubs.

The Greenway passes through many different villages, where there are fascinating historic buildings and sites of interest. When you explore the Quantocks it is always important to have due consideration and regard for other users of the rights of way and quiet lanes. Somerset County Council, the National Trust and Forestry Commission all have extensive estates in the AONB but the majority of the land is owned by a mixture of large private estates and small to medium sized farms.

The West Somerset Coast Path and Coleridge Way are two other promoted routes that link into the Greenway near East Quantoxhead.
